FIRST SCENE - SAMPLE

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SCENE ONE

LIGHTS UP ON THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE.

A large Canadian flag is on the UC wall.

D.R. is a desk and chair facing the audience. A red phone is on the desk.

D.L. is a smaller desk and chair facing the audience. A red phone and an iPad like device are on the desk. The desks are two to three feet apart.

PRIME MINISTER SYLVIA JACOBS (50-75) (speaks with an east coast accent) sits at the D.R. desk.

Sylvia is serious as she reads and jots on a book on her desk.

ALFRED (20), her sub prime minister, reads from a folder at the D.L. desk.

- SYLVIA You know Alfred, a hundred years ago producing oil was considered detrimental, but now, in 2124, we can't get it out of the sand fast enough. Because we have the last oil on the planet, China and the U.S., and the whole world, are desperate for Canadian oil.
- ALFRED It's a good thing.
- SYLVIA To the average mind (smirks to Alfred) that could look like a blessing but it's not. As the prime minister of the country, it's up to me to see this Country through these perilous times.

They stand and walk in front of their desks, possibly sit on the desks.

- ALFRED Because it was easier to pump oil out of wells than strain it from sand, it's logical Canadian oil would be the last to go.
- SYLVIA Oil's at the heart of my current predicament.
- ALFRED If you abide by the International Democratic Imperative Oil Treaty all nations signed, things will move along fine.
- SYLVIA The International Democratic Imperative Oil Treaty, better known by its acronym, IDIOT.
- ALFRED IDIOT allows all nations a way to share the last of the world's oil fairly. I like IDIOT.

SYLVIA	Takes one to know one.	
	Sylvia snickers as Alfred reacts.	
	Sylvia turns serious.	
	IDIOT has saddled me the responsibility of seeing that oil is parceled out fairly, and I intend to do it. Alfred, you think I'm doing okay though, right?	
ALFRED	Better than okay! Prime Minister, you're an over achiever. You will always think you haven't done enough. Let's review your record since you were elected.	
SYLVIA	That's a pretty good idea.	
ALFRED	You've enacted numerous historic policies to benefit Canadians. Moving the nation's capital to Flin Flon was a good idea.	
SYLVIA	Being located pretty much at the centre of the country, Flin Flon, Manitoba made the perfect location for the capital. Keeps everybody pulling together.	
ALFRED	Parliament hill, with the spectacular view of the river, was a good location for a condo development. Condos for the homeless was a stroke of genius.	
SYLVIA	Gives them something to do.

SYLVIA	Alfred, you're right! I'm getting smarter and smarter.
